BEST PRACTICE OF COLLEGE

Title of the practice: Social concern for pregnant women, nursing mothers and young children nutritional care in collaboration with Anganbadis of Durg District through Youth Red Cross Team of College.

Objectives of the Practice:

- As part of policy of social responsibilities the, the students of college who are focused members of youth red cross team participate in social & medical concern of region
- To continuously monitor the health issues of women & children associated with the anganbadis of region
- To find out the number of beneficiaries of low strata women & children associated with the anganbadis of district..

The Context:

- The Youth Red Cross Team of about 100 students from all streams under convener supervision have been selected to participate in visit to approx.31 Anganbadis periodically every month in groups to monitor the beneficiaries, the women who are pregnant, nursing mothers, infants and young children.
- The groups are involved in interaction with the subjects and impart basic nutritional awareness, address health issues to all along with the staffs of Anganbadi.
- Visit was approved through tie-ups with Anganbadis and certificates of conducts of our students were obtained through regular feedback from subjects and staffs.

The Practice:

Our college Youth Red Cross volunteers under the monitoring of Convenor has tied up with 31 anganbadis, constantly working for upliftment of underprivileged sections of society. The Anganwadi of Durg are continuously working for betterment of health & awareness of women and children of region. To contribute to society, our students are continuously making efforts for awareness of women and young children. The students are frequently visiting to the anganbadis and are carrying awareness programmes related to education and tips to pregnant & nursing mothers and infants and young children about nutrition and personal hygiene. They are also providing primary level teaching to young children.

Evidence of Success:

The youth red cross 100 enthusiastic members of college has established tie-ups with about 31 Anganbadis, and visited regularly to the anganbadis with purposeful programmes. The in charges have appreciated the efforts of college representatives. The beneficiaries have joined the sessions throughout overwhelmingly and have expressed as positive feedbacks for the entire programmes. Our students have also participated with high spirits of contribution to society.

BEST PRACTICE: MOR NONI YOJNA (MNY - MY DAUGHTER SCHEME)

Financial support to economically deprived female students under Colleges' scholarship schemes – Mor Noni Yojna & Currently running financial support under Late Shri B. J. Agrawal Memorial scholarship.

Objectives of the Practice

- To provide learning opportunities to economically poor girl students of the College to attain higher education by financial support for fees.
- To develop confidence among economically deprived girl students that they will always get financial support from the College.
- To collaborate and associate with charitable trusts, philanthropic organizations & individuals to mobilize financial help for female students from economically deprived backgrounds.
- Faculties deeply care and actively support students from economically poor backgrounds.

The Context

Many of the students who belong to rural background with poor financial background are acquiring education, for those who need financial support. The Teaching Staff of college came forward to help such needy students. Under Mor Noni Yojna, faculties adopt students from economically poor background and take responsibilities of admission fees, examination fees and relevant financial need. Currently, financial support under Late Shri B. J. Agrawal Memorial scholarship has been started by Professor D. C. Agrawal.

The Practice

Our Institution is the only government girls college in Durg District, which is renowned due to best results and highly qualified faculties, with all core subject at graduate and post graduate level Arts, Commerce, Home Science and Science Performing Arts, Sculpture.

The number of admission seeking students on merit basis is increasing year by year. Being a government college the education is almost free, only a nominal admission and examination fees is charged, the maximum girls seeking admission are from very low economic background but have very good academic results, which appears to be a very positive sign of girls' interest in education and empowerment. This made faculties to come forward and help students in all the ways they can support.

Financial constraint is a major reason, which has blocked academic growth. The flagship schemes of financial aids have been launched by the College with the aim to give opportunity to every deserving girl student, a growth shot at higher education regardless of economic condition.

The teaching staff of the College voluntarily came forward to become Teacher Guardian to financially adopt students and also mentor them regularly to resolve their relevant issues. The College considers this as a best practice, in which adopted students are supported & financial constraints and the Teacher Guardian could offer more than usual.

It is necessary that people must come forward and adopt students not only for financial help but also look after for other necessities, guidance and counseling. As this girls come from families of not only poor parents, but as well as very low or no educational background, so maybe they won't be able to understand.

Evidence of success


During the year i.e. 2022-2023, 36 girl students have been the beneficiaries which have been provided freeships by the College. A total sum of Rs. 36,695 was distributed as fellowship under various flagship scheme, Mor Noni Yojna (MNY) & Late Shri B. J. Agrawal Memorial scholarship. The break-up of the total disbursed amount is:, Mor Noni Yojna –INR 8,250 , total beneficiaries – 08, Late Shri B. J. Agrawal Memorial scholarship _ INR 28445, total benefeciaries -24. This initiative has created an environment of trust and belief among the economically deprived students that they can always bank on the College and Teachers for financial requirements of their higher education. In the upcoming academic sessions, the number of such scholarship/ freeships will be increased so that more number of needy students receives tuition fees and exam fees from the College, Teacher guardians and other philanthropic organizations.

Problems Encountered & Resources Required

Most of the students belonging to Schedule Tribe, Schedule caste, OBC and Minority are already provided government scholarships, but some underprivileged students are unable to receive such, for them it is essential to provide a helping hand, so that they can achieve higher education.

The core aim of these scholarship schemes would be fully achieved only when more charitable trusts, philanthropic organizations & individuals and College teaching staffs come forward and extend help from the core of their hearts with good spirit. Actual purpose will not be fulfilled just by providing fees amount but also motivational counseling and providing other resources such as text books, reference books, notes, other study materials etc., to deserving students.




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
