With the mission to focus on development of women through education and to support them through life, skills, community-oriented courses, it was established in 1982, and is run by Higher education Department, Government of Chhattisgarh. The college has grown to strength of about 3661 girls', enrolled in UG, PG, Diploma & Ph.D. programmes in Arts, Performing Arts, Commerce, Language, Home Science, Science, Business Administration. The highly dedicated staffs, their efforts have given fragrance to the laurels of institute. Our institute is now proving as best facilitator for our girls' creative evolution.

Our institute is affiliated to Hemchand Yadav University, Durg and has been accredited in 3rd cycle of Accreditation with B++ Grade with 2.79 CGPA in 2021 by NAAC, recognized as Star College in DBT Star college scheme in 2021. The College campus spreads in 10 acres of land and its infrastructure was enhanced last year with the construction of new buildings attached to the pre-existing older construction.

The girls' representation in sports in state and national international level and their grand success has lead the institute ranking to be top brass institute. The limited resources of institute as been utilized in its best way to give outstanding performances in academics, research, curricular, cocurricular and extracurricular activities.

College infrastructure consists of 25 classrooms, 13 Laboratories, one smart classroom, IQAC room, Incubation Centre, Gym, indoor sports room, NSS room etc. Regular Yoga camps are organized and institute exhibit extension activities through large participation of our students in NSS.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY OF IDP

The vision of the institution is to enlighten, empower the learners and ensure that the students are properly facilitated for qualitative improvement. The institution is keen to see that the students studying in the institution have sufficient facilities to learn, read, play & grow.

The first priority is **to build sufficient infrastructure** like well-equipped ICT classrooms, Computer Centre, playground, an auditorium, spacious library and state of the art laboratories, hostel for girls, differently abled friendly campus, proper sanitation and drinking water facility and green ambience.

In our college, incorporation of innovative teaching methodologies is practised in every stage to empower students. We as higher education institute need to add more pedagogical tools. we need to be more autonomous, accountable, decentralized, and transparent.

An assortment of committees and cells for focussing on student centric are functioning to empower the students like Placement cell, Women Empowerment and Harassment prevention cell, NSS, Red Cross, Scouts and Guides, Sports committee, Cultural committee, Red Ribbon and Students welfare committee.

An integration of ERP management in our institute will help in Robust Grievance Redressal Mechanism at Institution level; and Leadership training and Continuous Professional Development.

The alumni of the institution have been instrumental in launching various programmes in the campus. All these cells community oriented and provide opportunities for students to serve the society at large.

Another important initiative of the institute is to set up central library with ILMS facilities so that both students and teachers are provided with e-books and e-journals. The library also wishes to increase the number of journals and renew subscriptions of previously subscribed journals. The institution has plans to create functional subject-wise forums in each of its

departments, wherein every department is asked to conduct outreach programs like seminars, workshops, conferences at all levels and use the resources of both students and its faculty to benefit society at large.

The students act as resource persons in extension programmes in villages in implementing various Government projects for eg, Eco-club, Life-skills club and Health Camps. Since the learning outcome/ success ratio of the students is average, the institution has plans to improve their examination results through Remedial classes. Coaching classes for Competitive exams will be conducted to increase their employability. To increase their self-employment, Certificate courses on Computer Applications, Secretarial practices, Business Administration, Apparel designing and Beautician/ fashion designer course will be introduced. The institution also has plans to impart computer skills to its faculty, administrative staff and students and make them techno-savvy so that they can learn more and they can be more productive. The goal is to see that all the teaching faculty get registered for Ph.D. supervisor and all of them publish articles in peer-reviewed journals. To improve the pedagogical practises and subject specific knowledge of the faculty, certain training programmes will be arranged. To upgrade the management skills of administrative staff and faculty, training on Soft skills, supportive facilities will be provided by drafting policies.

- The appointment of new teachers to reduce the high student-teacher ratio seems to be essential and our students may be benefited.
- Available college unconstructed land can be effectively utilized for infrastructure expansion as per needs like classrooms, Laboratories, hostel facilities for students.
- Entrepreneurial courses can be launched
- Industry institute partnerships can be enhanced for better placements & career opportunities of students.
- More value added courses, certificates & Diploma Courses can be launched.
- More proactive role of Alumnii and their involvement in resource mobilization.
- The appointment of new regular teachers to reduce the high student-teacher ratio seems to be essential and our students may be benefited.

CHALLENGES:

- Inadequate interface with industries, national institutes.
- Limitations in placement of students
- Lack of seed money provisions for research and extension activities.
- Growing vacancies in regular teaching positions
- Economic status of students- a poor economic status of students coming from rural, urban and tribal background.
- GER to be tracked, as most girl students are unable to continue higher degree programmes & research due to their economic and cultural limitations.

- To introduce new courses to make education accessible to more women students from rural areas and less privileged sections of the society.
- To enhance the quality of courses currently offered by making them more relevant, skill focused and responsive to the demands of the employment industry and to introduce Add on courses to improve employability of the students.

- To create institute industry partnership
- To motivate teachers and PG / UG students to be proactive in research & development.

ACTION PLAN

A. Improving employability of graduates

The institution has plans to train students in various employable skills like learning.

In order to increase the learning outcomes of the students the institution has directed all the departments to adapt all measures to improve the results like taking remedial classes for slow learners and taking the help of advanced learners to assist the slow learners.

D. Achieving the targets of 60% of eligible UG and PG programs

The UG and one PG Programs of the college is accredited and further efforts will be made to accreditation for other new Programs and certificate courses within two years of joining the project.

E. Implementation of Academic and Non-academic reforms

The College comes under Hemchand Yadav University, Durg, C.G. The admission process is highly transparent. It is done in accordance with the set norms, rules and regulations laid down by the Government of Chhattisgarh. It is notified on notice board. Print media and website are also used to maintain transparency in admission process. Reservation provisions are followed during admissions.

An action plan is needed for the phase-wise introduction of substantive academic reforms in the institutions of higher education in the country. Academic reforms are a key towards imparting better quality education that is oriented towards employability and innovation. In addition to changes in the existing system, we need to introduce new policies that would make the higher education system more flexible to the needs of the students and the society.
