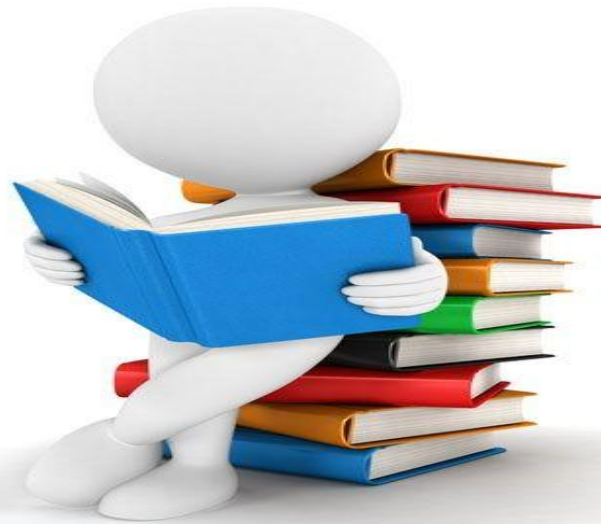

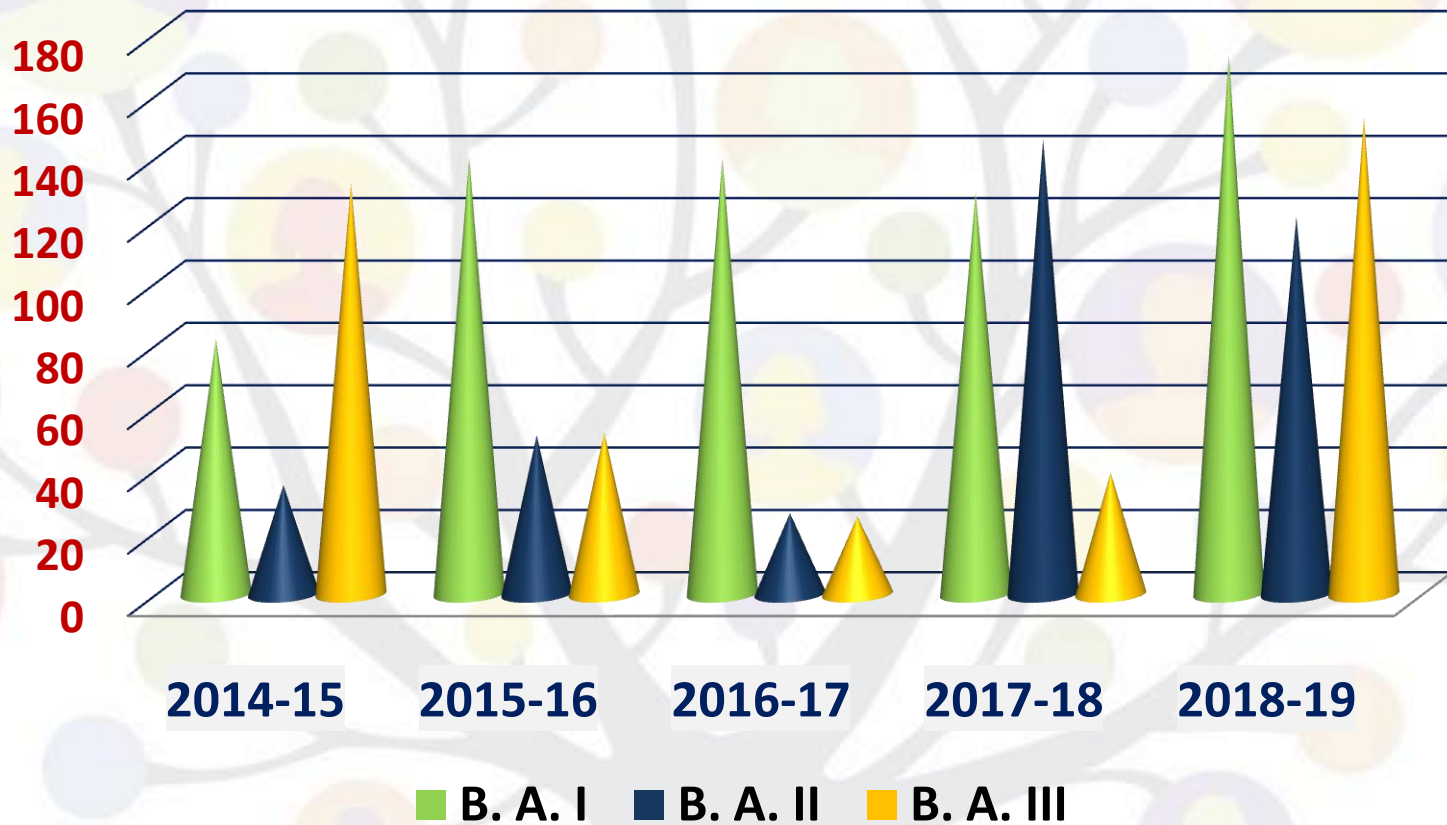
Number of Posts (Sanctioned & Filled)

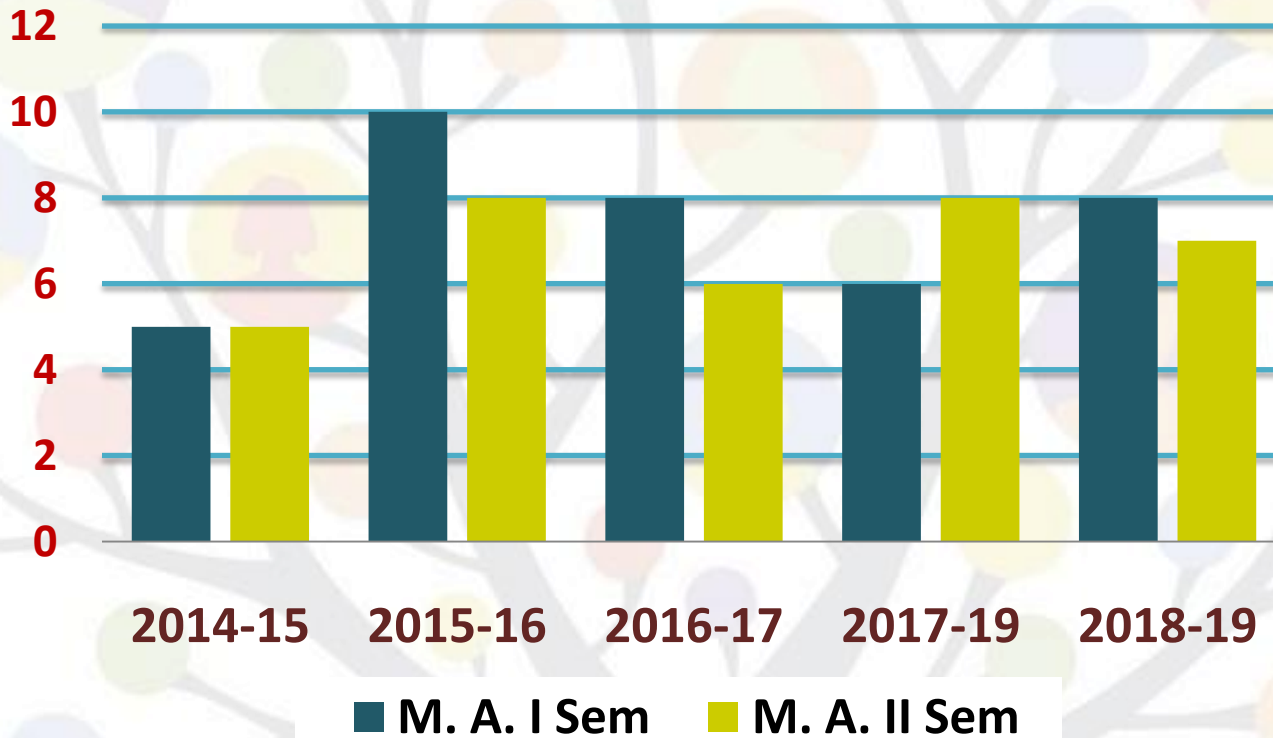
Students Strength (admitted)

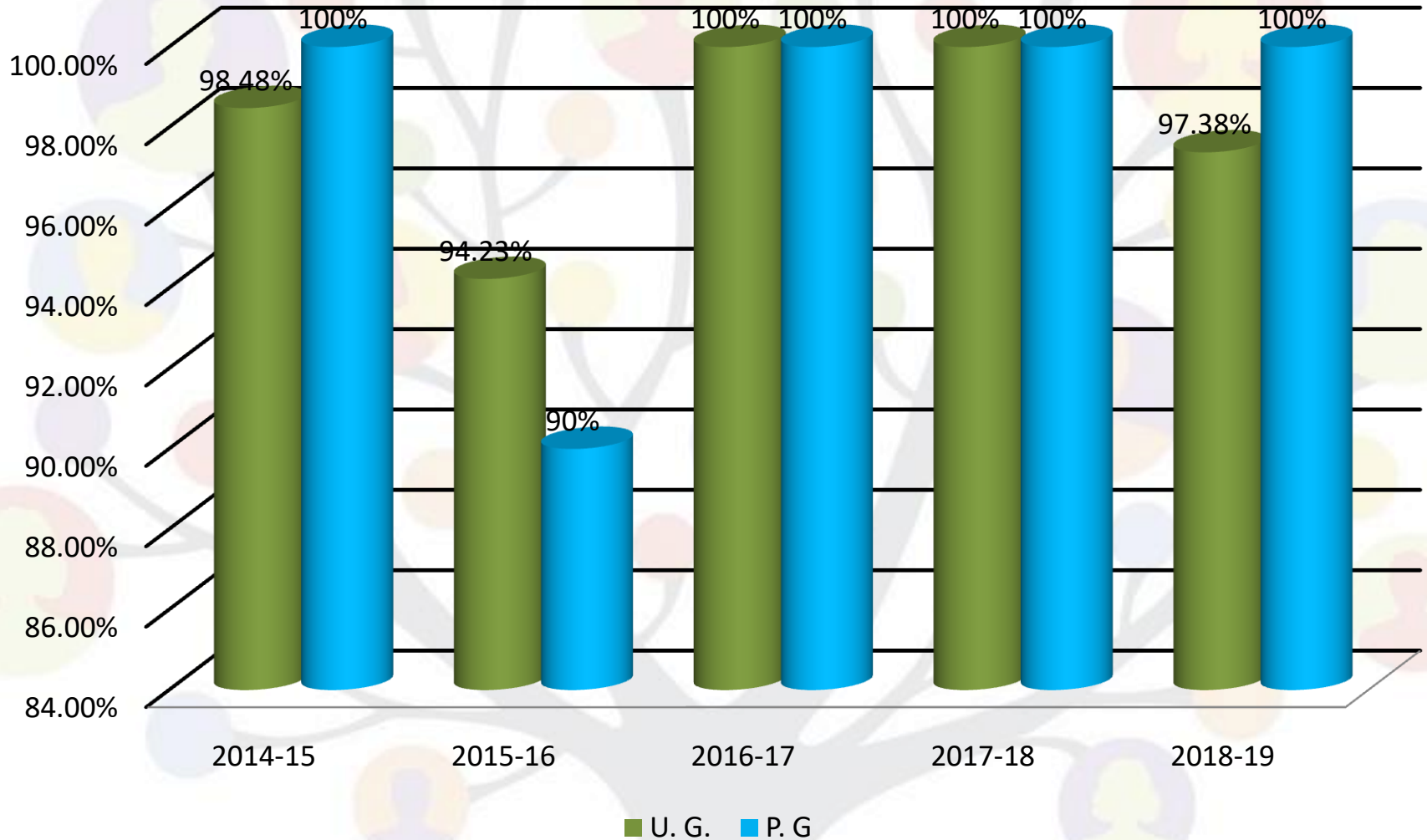

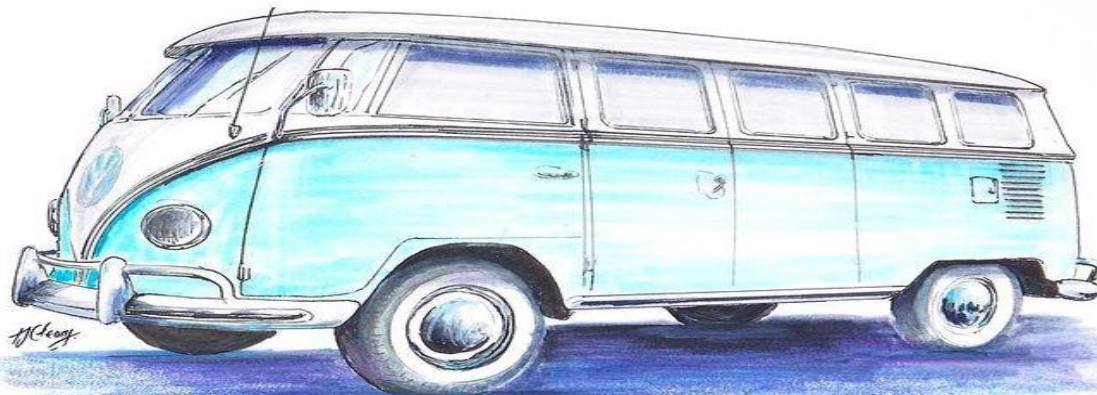
